The September Division Meeting was a little lightly attended for our fall kick-off, maybe you had other things going on that day but those in attendance enjoyed plenty of free coffee and donuts. Laurel Allen filled in for vacationing coffee princess Janet Mattern who was off on a anniversary cruise with husband Terry.

President Allen got the show on the road promptly at 10:00 AM and kicked the meeting off by welcoming everyone back from their summer

hibernations.

Secretary Lautazi reported that we 243 active paid members in the Division. Total TCA membership within our boundaries is still over 300 so we still have an opportunity to reach out to those who belong to TCA but not the Division or Chapter to join in the fun.

Next, Treasurer Bob Herman had the financial report. The invoice from Lionel for the first ever Mint Car that features an illuminated pulsing glowing load was paid during the summer recess. The checking account reflects that payment. Savings Account has a balance of \$27,801.88 and Checking now has \$5,683.34.

The Cumbres and Toltec Boxcar has sold over 250 cars sporting the new and very colorful C&TS railroad logo and has posted a profit of about \$1,800 towards the 2019 convention. The second car, the Los Alamos Mint Car with its mysterious glowing load, has now sold over 360 units and needs to sell about 70 more cars to get out of the red and into the black.

President Allen announced the two fall auctions to be held at Shepherd of the Valley, one G Gauge Only auction which was held on September 17<sup>th</sup> and the annual November Turkey Auction which will be held on November 26<sup>th</sup> the Saturday following Thanksgiving.

Chris also answered questions about the return of the Desert Division Train Meet which will be held on Saturday December 10<sup>th</sup> at the Shrine Auditorium in Phoenix. After missing a year because of contract disputes with our former location, the date was moved back one week and the Train Meet was downsized. Approval of Agenda -The agenda was approved as distributed

**Approval of Previous Meetings Minutes –** The previous meeting's minutes were approved as distributed.

**Membership Report** - Angelo reported that membership stands at 243 members.

<u>Treasurers Report</u> - Treasurer Bob Herman reported that the Savings Account has \$27,801.88 and Checking has \$5,683.74. Bob submitted the Income/Expense report for Apr. 2016. It was noted that the invoice for the Lionel Los Alamos Mint cars was paid.

#### **Old Business:**

**Fall Toy Train Meet 2016** – After several site visits the Shrine Auditorium was chosen as the site for the Desert Division Train Meet. The Shrine Auditorium is located near Sky Harbor Airport in Phoenix off 40<sup>th</sup> Street and will be a one day show. Ray Pomper has agreed to be the Meet Chairman. After reviewing the proposed budget for the show the admission was set at \$6 single, \$10 couple, Children under 16 free. This will be a day of, one day meet, vendors will setup the morning of the meet and not the day before.

Rio Grande Fundraising Cars - Sales of the Los Alamos Mint car are at 364 units. Sales of the C&T car are at 250. Chris mentioned that the figures he distributes to the board members are approximations based on major expense categories. He does not know all the expenses related to either project, but overall the first car was a success and the Mint Car will still need some help to keep sales steady until that car begins to post a profit. The third fundraising car will continue to be on hold until the second nears profitability.

<u>September G Gauge Only Auction</u> – September 17<sup>th</sup> Shepherd of the Valley Church (SOV). Additional lots were added and the auction stands at about 180 lots. Setup will begin at 7:00 AM, Preview at 9:00, auction begins at 10:00. There will be coffee, soda and donuts and light snacks but no lunch.

<u>Trailer at Rail Fair</u> – Saturday and Sunday October 8 & 9, 10:00 AM – 5 PM both days. Chris will drop the trailer off Friday afternoon but setup will begin Saturday morning. Need to recruit volunteers for all time slots especially Sunday afternoon teardown. The Board would like to appoint a full time Trailer Chairman.

<u>Christmas Holiday Party</u> – Chris spoke to the Presidents of GCMR and the P&P regarding the member and spouse gift policy. The overwhelming majority of their members who attend the Christmas Party are already members of Desert Division. All agreed that only TCA members and their spouses will receive the member gift and any extras, if available, will be offered to the guests at our cost.

<u>Storage Unit</u> – The club was able to get a second large storage unit adjacent to our current one. Chris and Chet installed new shelving in August and began moving auction items into the new unit. The module trailer, which was moved offsite due to lack of space, will be moved back into the original unit following Rail Fair.

Setup will be on Friday and the new location has an adjoining kitchen so the food format, "Souper Bowl", will be the same.

### **TCA Rio Grande Chapter News**

#### **Show and Tell:**

Greg Palmer showed a Hornby Dublo Engine and Tender. The Engine is slightly larger than HO but smaller than OO scale and can run on 3-rail DC track. These trains were made in England 1938 but not sold until after the war 1948-49. He then showed an Ives Set #1122 Engine + three passenger cars made by Lionel in 1929. These die cast engines were made of a zinc alloy which disintegrates over time. Greg showed a Junior Bridge Company signal bridge and Classic Toy Train article about the company's unique history and the son, Steven a doctor who later made handicap adaptive toys. He also had Sauerisen Electric Heater cement and Rocksel ceramic heater cement used by Lionel to repair smoke units for decades.

Jim Trever showed a Hornby Dublo catalog, a Bayko Construction catalog, and a Gilbert Atomic set postcard ad circa 1950. Bill Lubert showed both Westbrook Pre-war O Scale cars and kits. These were craftsman kits requiring great skill to assemble.

Boyd Reasor showed his homemade display shelf and 2 American Flyer cars he was donating for raffle prizes, noting as he unpacks his trains he continues to add more shelving.

#### I Had One of Those... by Jan Athey, TCA National Librarian

Between 1953 and 1956 Lionel offered a novel Model Railroad Printing Kit designed to help boys plan their first layout or estimate track requirements to expand existing layouts. Track stamps in the kit were scaled to  $\frac{1}{2}$  to an inch of the actual layout. Boys could use the kit to build simple 4 x 8 foot layouts or employ their imaginations to create fanciful layouts with switches, crossings and spurs going all over the place.

The Lionel Model Railroad Printing Kit contained a plastic sheet with stamps for straight and curved track, crossovers and switches. It included a ring-shaped holder that fit on the back of the track stamps plus an ink pad.

A new way to plan your first layout or to astimate track requirements to expend your pile. Track stamps in the kit are scoled to is of an inch to an inch of your actual layout.
