Treasurer Thompson reported the following balances: Checking \$10,323.52, Savings \$1,496.45 PayPal \$1100.62, the combined total in the three CD accounts is \$21,974.40.

First, was a piece of Lionel headquarters, an actual small piece of tile from the entryway, when the building was sold and remodeled in 2008. Next, he presented some unusual items a three car O gauge set from the UK Mill Brothers circa 1930. Also presented was an Electric Toy Company 1911-1913 #1 gauge hopper and some prewar Lionel literature included with sets. Greg also recalled that when he worked for the Cumbres and Toltec he would come down to the AT&SF storehouse which is now the wheels museum where we are meeting. Specifically, he remembered purchasing Fairmont M-19 speeder at the scrap price of \$.04 per pound. He later sold the speeder for a profit, but they now go for 10-20k. Chris Allen, visiting the Chapter from Arizona, brought several engines to show and run including a Lionel 773 and an MTH early RailKing 2926. Chris gave a short dissertation on why the modern Lionel Hudson can be a poor performer. He explained that his 1960's unit is the small motor version and that he is actively looking for a postwar large stack motor to install in his Hudson runner. Chris Wieclaw brought an MTH scale Santa Fe Northern that was bargain priced but not running. He was able to get it running.

We took a break and went out to the Wheels Museum layout and ran several engines to the enjoyment of the public and Chapter members. It was interesting to compare Chris Allen's RailKing Northern to Chris Wieclaw's Premier Northern, though they both had great sounding whistlers and ran very smoothly.


One other item. I will not be running for President next year. If you are interested, please contact me and we can discuss the position. Keep the rolling stock going.

Pizza Meetza Auction



Desert Division is pleased to host our annual Pizza Meetza Auction. This auction offers the opportunity to purchase, at auction, a broad variety of trains, track, buildings, transformers, train room signs and pictures. You still have time to participate! Bring your items to the May Meet, Saturday, May 13 and check in with auction chairman Paul Malek. The auction will be held following the General Meeting and our pizza buffet. The variety of items is as diverse as the free pizza's you will eat.

This will be a new format and the auction crew will begin setting up prior to the May General Meet. We need a few volunteers who can help with the setup to be at Fellowship Hall Saturday morning 7:30 to unload and begin setting up the auction.

To avoid confusion and speed the setup we ask that you do not begin viewing the items until invited to do so by the auctioneer. We hope to begin the auction at 12:00 noon.

The auction will be split into a consignment auction featuring about sixty lots of trains. There will be a printout sheet available in the newsletter and at the May Meet. You must have a bidders card for this part of the auction.

Following the consignment auction will be a member tabletop auction. Members may purchase a six-foot round table and split it up into four lots. Members who do not have four lots are encouraged to work with other members to purchase one table to keep your costs low. You will be responsible for making change for the items you sell off your tabletop.

All items will be sold in lots, as is where is, there is no warranty as to the condition of any item. Although known or obvious defects will be noted by the auctioneer, you should examine all items before bidding. Buyers are strongly advised to examine each item of interest during the viewing and inspection time prior to the auction. Purchases are final upon payment and receipt of your purchases. **There is no Buyer's Premium**. Decisions on bidding and successful bids will be made by the auctioneer and will be final.

To keep the auction timely the minimum bid increment up to \$50 will be \$1, from \$50 to \$100 will be \$5. You must pay for all your merchandise at the conclusion of the auction. You will be given a printout with all your purchases with the winning bid amount and upon payment, your items will be delivered to you.
