


Thanks to Nick Ladd, these cars were specially constructed for K-Line by Lionel out of real Copper. They are similar to the cars which were used as Banquet Table prizes at the 55<sup>th</sup> Annual TCA Convention held at the Phoenix/Scottsdale Desert Ridge JW Marriott in 2009. There are differences, and they are significant. First of all, the loads are a sparkling Ruby, which is the jewel associated with all 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversaries. One end of the Hopper is emblazoned with data about the formation about the formation of the Desert Division, plus each car is individually numbered from 002 to 104. The same number appears on its box. Upon the sides of the Hopper is a small decal which discreetly shows off the Division's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Logo. The hatches on the bottom of the Hopper are spring loaded and actually work, manually. The total weight of this car is in excess of two pounds, so it is quite substantial.



You would expect to spend in excess of \$125.00 for such a special car, and at that price it would be a bargain. However, we can offer it to you for the unbelievably low price of just \$ 65.00, if you can pick it up at one of our meets in September or October, or at the Banquet on October 22, 2011. Should we need to ship it to you, we ask that you add an additional \$10.00 to the cost, which is below what it will cost us to ship it to you, but the Division has agreed to pick up the difference.

## HISTORIAN’S CORNER – THE MISSING ARTICLE

For many years I worked both as a volunteer and later chair of the old Division modular layout. In those days the module ran Standard gauge, postwar on an old ZW, and later TMCC/ProtoSounds. For the first fifty years TCA had been mainly about the “C”, or rather the collecting side of toy trains. However, recently a new awareness that most operators have amassed a rather large collection themselves and that even our tinplate forefathers enjoyed playing with current production trains, the operating side is garnering its own following in our Association.

The collecting side of toy trains is usually broken into categories such as pre-war, post-war, MPC, modern, etc. but from the operating side of things it is really the old, shall we say AC powered layouts vs. the new layouts powered by a variety of digital circuitry. For months I have been promising an article I remember written by Division member Bill MacDowell. I remember how he solved a rather common annoyance using a very minimalistic approach for use on those old Standard gauge and postwar layouts.

That annoyance? The rather unrealistic operation of the Lionel 154 crossing signal using the 154C contactor. As you may remember the contactor was attached to the track and as the metal wheels of the train ran over the connector it made or broke the connection for a herky-jerky flashing of the 154 crossbuck. Bill solved this situation by using the 145C contactor used on a variety of crossing gates and an automobile turn signal flasher. The turn signal flasher provided a more realistic appearance of alternating lights on the crossbuck and I have used his circuit with slight modifications over the years for a wide variety of projects for “old school” train layouts. I also sent a version of it to a friend wanting an inexpensive approach to wire up a real railroad crossbuck using common automobile parts. For those of you who like blinky light projects, Bob Herman also wrote an article on how to install a “free standing” flasher in Lionel #83 and #87 crossing signals. I have been unable to uncover Bill’s original article but Bob’s appeared in the June 1998 issue of the DISPATCH.



Being a baby boomer has afforded me the opportunity to watch the explosion of electronics into our hobby and more realistic operating accessories. I also see blinking LED’s appearing in a wide variety of children’s toys. Using the creative approach that both Bill and Bob have shared with us, I now use a rather inexpensive flashing light kit in an inexpensive “junk crossbuck” I bought at a swap meet for my grandson to use as a night light, as a free standing attention getter at sales tables, and set up on portable layouts. Come to the September meet and I will have a variety of them on display in everything from nightlights to Marx. By the way, October is fast approaching. Keep a look out for a wide variety of inexpensive LED’s to appear in local stores from everything like safety strobes to pumpkin “flames.” Use your imagination, and create your own layout project, and then share it with us.

I have been remiss in acknowledging the contributions of numerous members helping me fill in the gaps of the Desert Division’s last decade. Ivan English donated a thumb drive full of pictures from the Lionel Train Centennial Celebration along with the Apache dynamite “G” boxcar, Brad Martin donated a cap from the 2009 convention to go with the cap from 1997, and I continue to get photos from a wide variety of members.

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


