Tim is a postwar Lionel collector looking specifically for coil couplers, but then again anything trains will also get him to look twice.

Treasurer Bob Herman gave the financial report and noted that the Savings Account was at \$27,803.89 and Checking had \$10,745.56. Since

we are currently taking pre-orders for the Harvey House Car, some of that balance is pre-order monies that will be used to pay the invoice when it comes due this summer.

Chris relayed a conversation from Peter Atonna that early sales of the Harvey Company car are doing well and that he has already received a paint sample. Peter has asked for one small change and feels the car will go into production soon and should make for an on-time delivery this summer.

Next Chris mentioned that he is required to file a Division Annual Report each year with the National Board of Directors. Part of that requirement is an accurate membership count. You may have noticed that our membership took a dip from recent numbers. Chris and Angelo worked together and discovered the drop is due in part to local members not keeping their National TCA dues current. We also discovered that there are 113 TCA members who live in the Division boundaries that do not pay local Division dues. This fall we will begin to send out solicitation letters asking these members to join us as we ramp up train season both the Division and

Currently Chris is sending many of these members a free copy of the Division newsletter to members of this group that might be within a reasonable drive to the Phoenix or Albuquerque meeting location. After explaining the need to keep costs down by printing and mailing a minimum each month it was suggested that these copies be stamped or marked "Complimentary Copy". - editor's note, starting with this issue the newsletter is so marked for those TCA members who do not pay Division dues.

A vendor has been sourced for the newest Division polo shirt project. Because we will not have a meet for several months this project will be put on summer hiatus and resume in the fall. The local company can offer the shirt in several fabric sources and because the newest trend is with lightweight "wicking" fabric, the logo cannot be embroidered onto the shirt with the fabric puckering around the embroidery. It was suggested that the Division log be made as a patch and that patch sewn onto the shirt. Because of that option extra patches might also be made available for individual sale. We hope to have all the information available when we meet again in the fall.

Chris announced that there would be Division elections this year. Steve Bienstock agreed to chair the election committee again and will solicit two other members to assist him. Greg Palmer, who currently holds a spot as a Division Director will be running for Chapter President so there is one immediate opening for Director on the slate. In addition, Chris announced that he will seek re-election as Division President because of his desire to see the 2019 National Convention through to completion.

Education Segment; Jonathan brought a Sakai HO locomotive that impressed him with its detail. He also brought along a "Hot off the Press"

Amtrak E9 that he recently received from 3rd Rail. We learned that these cars are more or less prototypical of the cars of the era. The graphics were sharp and made for a much more attractive car than the real deal. Roland LaHaie relayed the information that the Mesa Library has free train displays in July and August at the Main Branch downtown.

The meeting was called to order at 6:59 PM at the home of Mike and Michelle Dietrich

In Attendance; Chris Allen, Mike Dietrich, Bob Herman, Angelo Lautazi, Terry Haas. On teleconference Greg Palmer and David Nycz

Approval of Previous Meetings Minutes – The minutes from the previous BOD meeting were approved.

Secretary's Report - Angelo reported that current active (paid) membership is at 233

<u>Treasurers Report</u> - Treasurer, Bob Herman, reported that the Savings Account is \$27,803.89 and Checking is \$10,745.56.

Old Business:

TCA & Division membership –. There is approximately 100 TCA members that do not pay Division dues. Some live outside of what might be considered a reasonable commute to either the Phoenix or Albuquerque meeting locations. We also discovered a few members with pre-paid Division dues that have let their National TCA dues lapse. Angelo has written solicitation letters encouraging these members to become active in the Division. These will be sent out later this summer prior to our active fall train season.

<u>Christmas Holiday Party</u> – The Board agreed to a member gift however decided against the cloisonné club pins discussed last month. The Board authorized the Christmas Holiday Party to decide on the member gift.

<u>Fred Harvey Fundraising Car</u> – Chris gave a sales update on the first two cars. The Los Alamos has completely sold out and the Cumbres and Toltec car has only six cars remaining. The sales from these two cars have produced over \$11,000 in profits for the 2019 National Convention. Sales figures for the newest car, the Fred Harvey Company boxcar, is now at 108 units. Peter has received a paint sample and feels the car will possibly arrive early from Lionel this summer.

<u>Pizza Meetza Meet and Auction</u> – Continues to be very well attended and a very popular meet each year. It was noted that we continue to have excess pizzas the past few years. The plan for 2018 will be for a slightly smaller order. The Board appreciates the excellent job Beth Stange continues to do coordinating the event.

New Business:

2017 Annual Division Report – The fiscal year for TCA ends June 30th the required Annual Report was submitted. Chris provided a copy to the Board for review and it details the Division's events of the past year along with membership and financial information that is required. A printed copy will be available at the June meeting for review and members can contact Chris or check on the National TCA website for a soft copy.

<u>Polo Shirts</u> – Chris reported that Paul has secured a embroider vendor for the club's polo shirts. They have no minimums and will make the shirts by subscription. Price information will be available in the fall depending on the type of shirt the member orders, regular cotton or the new "wicking" fabric that is becoming popular.

<u>Fall Election</u> – Elections are this year. The Board will appoint a three member election committee to construct a slate of candidates. Chris announced he will run for re-election for one more term in order to see the 2019 National TCA Convention in New Mexico through to completion. Greg Palmer is running for Rio Grande Chapter President so that will open a Director spot on the Division Board.

<u>Auction Committee</u> – The November Auction is full and consignments are now being assigned to the January Auction. About forty items of Standard Gauge will be inventoried and placed on eBay this fall to secure a better return for our consignor.

2019 Convention Update – Chris reported on a recent teleconference held by the 2019 Convention Committee and feels everything is on track for a great convention. The Division will hold some of the profits from the first two fundraising cars to help offset the cost with the expected early arrival of the Harvey Company car this summer

<u>Adjournment</u>: Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 PM. The next Board meeting is scheduled to be on September 6, at the home of Angelo and Barbara Lautazi.

be running trains both days from 10:00 AM until 5:00 PM. We have trains to run or you can bring your own. Plan to join us for a few hours either day.



In Memoriam – Bob Johnston By Chris Allen TCA HE95-40580



Bob Johnston, one of the original 25 founding members of Desert Division, passed away suddenly on July 9^{th} , 2017.

When Sue called me with the news I was numb. I had just seen Bob a few weeks earlier and he was his usual happy self, telling jokes about his heritage, growing up in Wisconsin, chasing trains and everything in between.

I've known Bob since work and family life allowed him to get active in the Division again. He and Sue were a tremendous help to me personally as the Registration Chair during the 2009 convention and to the Division overall. Bob was a huge supporter of anything Desert Division and wore his 2009 convention vest religiously to Division events. Besides financial support for all the Division fundraising cars that never quite fit in with his passion for the Chicago Northwestern Railroad, he helped at almost every club sponsored event, most recently helping setup the module for the World's Greatest Hobby Show this past spring.

Many years ago, I volunteered with the oral history project for the TCA Library. It was our task to record whoever we felt had information on the early workings of TCA or Divisions and the memories of those members when they joined. During that time, I recorded the thoughts of past Division and National Presidents I had met during my time serving TCA. Seeing that I had become the Division Historian, I contacted Bob to see if he would like to be interviewed as well. "Why me?", he asked. Well, I'd like to hear your side of things. You have a unique view of someone who

stepped away and then came back. I find that story very interesting and I'd like it preserved in the archives.

Setting up the recorder on their kitchen table I could tell Bob was a bit nervous, but within minutes he was sharing stories of everything from Shop Class to buying trains from mailing lists and how things were like in the Valley of Sun during those early days. Bob had served as club Secretary/Treasurer during those early years when the two offices were one. With Sue by his side, (and often their children as well) I learned of early family vacations sometimes spent chasing trains and sometimes getting chased out of railroad yards. I came away from that interview with a whole new perspective of this quiet man, who had experienced life and his dreams with passion.

Bob was a musician and his love of music covered many genres and his handiwork and passion for tinkering and repairing went far beyond trains and into the musical instrument field. I guess the Shop Teacher or rather the Industrial Arts Instructor spark burned brightly within his soul. Although we are relatively close in age, the passion Bob had as an instructor, was like the man who directed my life so many years ago. Perhaps that is why I enjoyed being around Bob and hearing his life stories. My life, as I am sure so many of Bob's students were as well, was shaped by men with a passion of working with your hands as well as your mind. I learned the value to design, read from blueprints, construct, maintain and repair so much of the world around us.

Bob's smile, humor, and presence will be missed by all of us. We've lost an important connection to the beginnings of Desert Division, more importantly, we lost a good friend who can be proud that the club he began grew so large and is still active today,

A celebration of Bob will be held September 9, 2017 at Iron Works Restaurant, 17233 N. 45th Ave. at 1:00 p.m. Come and share good memories and food. HARVEY HOUSES

Many of you have driven to or thru Winslow, Arizona as you go east or west on I-40. Many of you have stood on the corner in Winslow. Some of you have spent the money and enjoyed an evening at the La Posada Hotel and have sat on the benches and watched the BNSF traffic. We know that Gordon and Christi Wilson stay only in room 101.

From the very first time I saw the La Posada, I have thought about how and who had renovated a former Harvey House. Oh, the days of steam engines pulling passenger cars and the Harvey Houses were the splendid hotels that travelers stayed in at night. I had learned that Tina Mion and Allan Affeldt were the people that had been the inspiration for the renovation. I mentally estimated how much money they take in for a full hotel and at the fantastic dining room. I have also heard that they were renovating the Harvey house in Needles, California. This I have not confirmed.

However; there is another story and you might be interested in it. After the UP Historical Society Convention in Denver, Dottie and I headed back to Gold Canyon on I-25. Some of you know that the word ANTIQUES on a billboard north of Las Vegas, New Mexico would result in us taking an exit. Yes! There is an antique shop on Railroad Avenue directly across the street from the Santa Fe Depot. It is a very nice antique shop and for the very first time, we found railroad

memorabilia. Some of it left the building on the 30th of lulv.

We did see a Fred Harvey small cup priced at \$160.00. We did see a Fred Harvey silver looking turin with no ladle priced at \$600. We bought three pieces of Union Pacific china and two Santa Fe butter saucers and two Santa Fe sugar containers with lids.

While Dottie was in the antique shop, I went over to the Santa Fe Depot, which is the Amtrak stopping point and the Information Center for Las Vegas. Pictures on the walls tell a lot of history.

North of the Depot, was a fenced in area and within the fence stands an abandoned building with the word Castaneda Hotel barely legible. When I asked the lady at the information center if that had been a Harvey House, she said, Yes! She then gave me a copy of the hotel and staff in 1899. On the back was an article about the furnishings and inside appearance in 1899.

I then was given an article written by Tina Mion or Allen Affeldt, stating that they are 90% confident that they had secured financing to renovate the Castaneda Hotel. A bank in "California has agreed to provide crucial NEW Markets Tax Credits and a new loan. Chase Bank has agreed to make a major investment in the project."

"As part of the restructuring Tina Mion and Allen Affeldt will give the Plaza and Castaneda Hotels to the Winslow Arts Trust, the 501-c3 we established for our Arizona philanthropy. The Arts Trust will be renamed and redefined to support arts, history and economic development projects in Winslow and Las Vegas NM. We will establish a new LLC, which will have a long-term lease from the Trust, to restore and operate the Plaza and Castaneda Hotels, so we will be involved. During the last three years we have made nearly \$1 million in improvements in the Plaza."

"We are also proceeding with our plan to lease the food and beverage business at both the Plaza and

Castaneda, just as we do at La Posada with the Turquoise Room. "Funding should be available so work can begin in October on the Castaneda. This is estimated to be \$3 million and should be done in 18 months, so we are targeting a 2019 Castaneda reopening, seventy years after it closed as a hotel."

Now you know the rest of the story. The Plaza Hotel is located west of I-25 on National Avenue. It is located on the northwest corner of the square.

Keep track of the renovations, if completed you might be able to stay here before or after the 2019 TCA Convention. Las Vegas, NM is about a 90 minute drive north of Albuquerque.
