# **ELECTION, TRAIN SHOW, CHRISTMAS PARTY**

We moved a minimal amount of chairs and tables because it became apparent that we were in for lightly attended meeting ahead.

Those that did attend had a great time with Janet Mattern back at the helm of the coffee corner and a nice selection of delights to get everyone's morning sugar rush going.

President Allen started the meeting at 10:06, looking over the sparse attendance, he noted that a key speaker today was missing and he would try to work around it.

Secretary Lautazi stated that the current active (dues paying) membership was at 215. He announced that there were no guests present at the meeting.

Bob Herman gave the Treasurers report with the Savings Account balance of \$19,808.66 and the Checking Account Balance of \$16,882.66. We are currently selling the excess Banquet Cars leftover from the 65<sup>th</sup> National Convention and those sales are helping our balance as well. Bob also reitterated again that a portion of the monies in the checking account is in escrow until the winter auctions settle out and the consignors are paid.

Chris mentioned that RailFair was next weekend and that the trailer would be dropped off Friday afternoon. Setup for the two day event was scheduled to begin at 7:30 Saturday morning with the public coming in the park starting at 10.

We will need operators from 10 AM until 5 PM Saturday and Sunday. Teardown will begin Sunday afternoon around 4:30 PM which will require a crew to help get everything packed up. Tear down should take less than an hour.

Chris talked about the search for a new meeting location next year which is ongoing. Because of costs two locations have been removed, a third is still waiting for a response on pricing for using the hall for only a half day rental. During the discussion it was asked what was the criteria that was being used for the search. He replied that a hall no smaller than half of what we presently are using able to hold about sixty people and that had fifteen to twenty, six-foot tables as part of the rental agreement. A new location was suggested, and Chris said that he would check it out and report at the next meeting.

Next, an impromptu poll was taken to determine where everyone drove in from. From the results it appears that the members present came from east of I-17 freeway, and mostly from Scottsdale and the East Valley.

Paul Wassermann spoke about the upcoming Christmas Holiday Party scheduled for Sunday December 8th. The party registration form is in this edition of the newsletter and there will be no tickets sold at the door since this is a plated dinner and an exact headcount is needed.

The November Train auction and the January Auction are filled. The November Auction is a little lighter than normal because a consignor backed out at the last minute and we were unable to back fill the lots. There will likely be a few addon lots so be sure to check out the auction in person or you just might miss out on a treasure or two.

Chris mentioned that he was hoping that the Election Chair would arrive to handle the Division nominations. He did contact him via the phone and reported that he had a previous engagement and was unable to attend the meet. He stated he had no nominations to announce.

On behalf of the Division Election Committee, Chris accepted nominations from the floor for the upcoming election. The following officers are running unopposed; Chris Allen Division President, Mike Dietrich Division Vice-President, Angelo Lautazi Division Secretary.

After serving for more than two decades, Division Treasurer Bob Herman has decided to put away his calculator and run as a Division Director instead. The Election Committee accepted the nomination of Mark Thompson for Division Treasurer. There were no other nominations for that office. Directors Jonathan Peiffer and Terry Haas have decided not to run for another term. Nominations for Division Director were Bob Herman, Paul Wassermann and Steve Bienstock. With no other nominations from the floor, the nominations were closed.

The ballot will have a spot for write in candidates and have the proposed Bylaws change that will bring the Desert Division election cycle into sync with TCA National. If the Bylaws amendment passes it will contain the following proviso; those members elected during this election will stay in office until June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022. This is an extra six months over the normal two-year term to allow the election cycles to immediately get synchronized with that of TCA national.

Christie Wilson announced that she was retiring from the office of National TCA Secretary. Paul Wassermann asked the club to thank Christie for her fourteen years of dedicated service to National TCA and she received a very deserved round of applause. Gordon Wilson nominated Chris Allen for the position of National Secretary. Dallas Dixon seconded, and it was approved unanimously by those present.

The educational segment featured Phil Todd who brought quite a bit of information about the trip of the UP Big Boy that will travel through Arizona next week. Phil told all present that after his personal experience this past summer chasing the Big Boy, Tucson is where you need to make plans if you want to get up and personal. Chris Allen brought in a hard to find K-Line by Lionel Wind Turbine. He wants to display it in the farm setting on the Division's modular layout.



#### PROPOSED DESERT DIVISION BYLAWS CHANGE

The Desert Division Board of Directors has reviewed and recommends the passage of one change to the structure of the Division Bylaws. This change will synchronize the Desert Division election cycle to that of TCA National. The second proposed change to remove an eligibility requirement for officers will be delayed because of input from the membership at both monthly Meetings held in September and October. Steve Bienstock, Desert Division election chair, has reviewed our Bylaws and has several other changes he would like to propose. They were received too late to be discussed in an open meeting forum for this year and will be presented at the January 2020 meeting. The only change to the Bylaws are listed below. A "Yes" to change the Division election cycle to sync with the national TCA election cycle will change all of the following sections to read as follows;

#### **ARTICLE III - OFFICES, DUTIES, TERMS OF OFFICE**

<u>Section 1</u>: (Unchanged)<u>Section 2</u>: (Unchanged)

**Section 3: Terms of Office and Vacancies** 

- A. The term of office for the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Directors shall be two (2) years.
- B. (Unchanged)
- C. (Unchanged)
- D. The term of office shall commence on July 1st.

#### ARTICLE V - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

**Section 1:** (Unchanged)

#### **Section 2: Election Committee**

- A. (Unchanged)
- B. The Chairperson of the Election Committee shall also accept nominations from the membership at the April Business meeting. The slate of candidates will be announced, and nominations will close at that time.
- C. The Chairperson of the Election Committee shall prepare a ballot, with provisions for write-ins, to be distributed on or about May 1 to all members in good standing. The ballot shall contain provisions to insure voter authentication. The election cycle will end on May 31.
- D. The Election Committee shall count the ballots prior to the June meeting and announce the results at the June meeting. Ballots and tally sheets shall be retained for ninety (90) days and then destroyed.
- E. Candidates with the largest plurality of votes cast shall be elected to the offices of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Director(s).
- F. The Secretary shall notify the candidates who do not attend the June meeting of the election results.

#### **ARTICLE VI - DIVISION MEETINGS**

#### Section 1: Annual Membership Meeting

The Annual Membership Meeting shall be the first business meeting of the calendar year. The financial report for the closing of the fiscal year shall be given at that time.

<u>PROVISO</u>, Upon acceptance of this Bylaws change, the term of office for those elected in the November 2019 election shall begin January 1, 2020 and end June 30, 2022
